1935 Silver Jubilee of King George V List of Common Design Printers and the Varieties

Printers

Printing for the common design stamps was undertaken by three companies. Waterlow & Sons prepared the master dies of the vignette and frames. Duplicates were provided to the other two printers. This accounts for the differences in varieties seen. Perforation size for the Waterlow and Bradbury printings were 11 x 12 whereas the De La Rue perforations were 13 1/2 x 14. The De la Rue printings contained the Frame Plate numbers on the bottom selvages (margins) under the second stamp in the bottom row (10/2) and Vignette Plate numbers under the fifth stamp in the bottom row (10/5). Although these were not present with the other printers the various plates have been identified. Bradbury and Waterlow undertook the printing for 15 colonies each (see below), while De La Rue did the printing for 14 colonies. The De la Rue company was also responsible for the issue of printing papers to all three printers.

Notes to Printings

Information from the De la Rue archives produced the following additional information

Specimen stamps – a total of 421 specimen stamps of each value for each colony was printed. There is no information regarding the numbers printed by the other two printers, but it is likely it was the same number.

Discrepancies are noted between the De la Rue and Crown Agents Archives with respect to numbers printed from the first printing of the below colonies (The tables above list the official numbers from the Crown Agents records).

Grading of Varieties

Grade	Description
Type A	Varieties commonly described, appearing in books or catalogues. These may be found on one or more stamps.
Type B	Known varieties, not commonly described, but found on two or more different stamps.
Type C	Known varieties, not commonly described, but found on one stamp only.
Type D	Described variety where the position of the stamp is unknown.

Notes:

1. Kenya, Uganda and Tanganyika 1/- has a frame variety (line through 0 of 1910) which is unique to this stamp only. It occurs in Row 4, Column 2.
2. Kenya, Uganda and Tanganyika 20c also has a frame variety (line starting in the right margin going diagonally through the date). It occurs in Row 3, Column 5.
3. Kenya, Uganda and Tanganyika 30c. Frame re-entry near value tablet. Plate 4/, Row 1, Column 6.
4. Northern Rhodesia 1d has one frame plate damage through most of column 6.
5. Part of Fiji 1 ½d issue is known to have the perforations pins arranged as irregular comb (giving the impression of line perforations) rather than regular comb perforation, which was the usual process. These stamps also differ in that they were perforated through the bottom margin instead of top margin.
6. The flagpole on top of the Round Tower has been described as being broken in a number of the De la Rue stamps. Virtually all occur on Plate 2A. All are not identical. Known examples are
 - a. Antigua 1 ½d
 - b. Bahamas 1/-
 - c. Basutoland 1d; 3d
 - d. British Guiana 2c (Rv2A-9/2 & 10/2); 24c
 - e. British Solomon Islands 1 ½d; 6d
 - f. Cayman Islands ½d
 - g. Ceylon 6c; 20c (Rv2A-10/5 & 10/6)
 - h. Dominica 1d; 1/-
 - i. Fiji 1 ½d
 - j. Kenya, Uganda and Tanganyika 20c
 - k. Northern Rhodesia 6d
 - l. St. Helena 2c (Rv2A 8/4 & 10/4)
 - m. St. Lucia ½d; 2 ½d
7. Albino frames have been described for:
 - a. Antigua 1/- (Frame printed double – 1 albino)
 - b. British Solomon Islands 6d (Frame printed triple with 2 albino – only 5 or 6 examples known) and 1/- (Frame printed double with 1 albino – only 3 examples known). There may also be an albino 1 ½d
 - c. Fiji 1 ½d and 1/- (Frame printed double – 1 albino)
 - d. Northern Rhodesia 6d (Only 8 copies known) (Frame printed double – 1 albino)
 - e. St. Helena 6d (Frame printed double – 1 albino)
 - f. St. Lucia 2 ½d (Frame printed double – 1 albino. Only one example known)

Note on De la Rue Plate Identification

The De la Rue printings contained the Frame Plate numbers on the bottom selvages (margins) under the second stamp in the bottom row (10/2) and Vignette Plate numbers under the fifth stamp in the bottom row (10/5), in the colour of the vignette.

Frame Plate 1A was used exclusively for Fiji. Frame Plate 1 was used for the other colonies. Not all Colonies used Frame Plate numbers. Of interest is that these were made individually for each Colony value. If one compares the frame measurements between the different stamps one will find slight variation in sizes. All sheets had vignette numbers printed. Vignette plate numbers (2A) and (2B), also called "abnormal" because of their position, are situated much lower and further away from the bottom stamp. They appear in print as 2A and 2B respectively and in many instances have been partially or completely cut off. Plate (2A) can also be identified by the presence of three slightly angled parallel lines found under the fifth stamp in the bottom row (10/5) but to the left of where the vignette number should be.

Vignette Plate Number 4 presents in two formats. In the first the Number 4 is found under Stamp 10/5. In the second format designated 4/ a 6mm vertical line appears under Stamp 10/6 usually in line with the left border of the Order of the Garter. Another short vertical line is found at the top of the sheet, above Stamp 1/6

Ainscough has developed a simple method of identifying the distance and position of the different plates. Using the flagstaff on the top of the Round Tower as the "anchor point" he has produced the following measurements. (Ref: Flagstaff 5th Edition p36. 1989)

Sheet numbers are found above the last stamp of Row 1 i.e. Row/Column 1/6. Note that not every colony had their sheets numbered. It appears that when half sheets were printed the sheet number was placed above the last stamp i.e. Stamp (Row/Column) 1/3
